Letter from our Board Chair

Dear Friends of Macon Area Habitat for Humanity,

As you read the 2025 Annual Report, I hope you feel the same pride and gratitude that I do for what our community has accomplished together this year. Because of your support, Macon Area Habitat for Humanity continues to build not only homes, but stability, opportunity, and hope.

In 2025, six families moved into new Habitat homes, each supported through homeowner education and more than 2,100 hours of sweat equity. Our impact extended well beyond the build sites, with 1,285 volunteers contributing over 5,600 hours in our ReStore, at community events, and through signature programs such as Women Build, Home Court, and Light More Homes. These efforts reflect the power of neighbors coming together around a shared mission.

We are proud of our strong financial stewardship, with more than \$2.48 million in revenue and a positive increase in net assets. This success would not be possible without the leadership of our Executive Director, Ivey Hall, whose dedication and vision continue to strengthen our organization. I am also deeply grateful for the service of our Board of Directors, staff, donors, and partners who make this work possible.

Thank you for standing with us and believing in the life changing impact of affordable homeownership. As we look ahead, we are hopeful and energized by the opportunities before us to serve more families and continue building a stronger future for Macon.

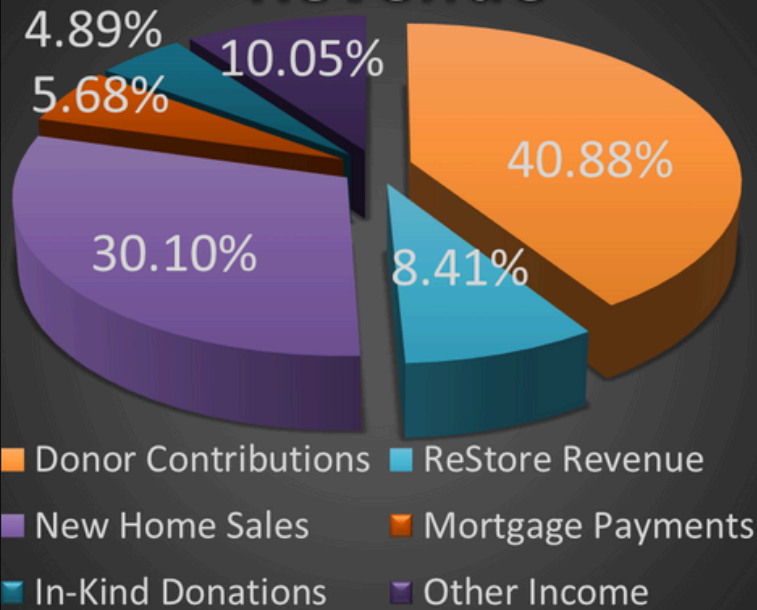

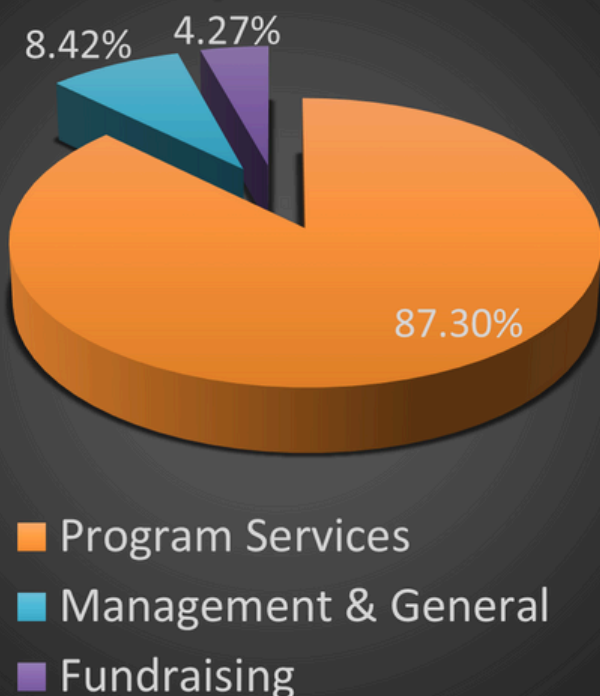

Home Court 2024

The annual Home Court Pickleball Tournament, held each October at Tattnall Square Park in partnership with Macon Pickleball, is a 3-day event welcoming players of all skill levels for singles and doubles matches. As one of Macon's first pickleball tournament, it drew over 130 participants from across the Southeast and raised over \$16,000 to support our mission to build more homes. Light More Homes 2024

Light More Homes is a testament to the power of community coming together to support a shared mission. This dazzling Christmas light display, held at Mercer Village and down Candy Cane Lane, creates a festive atmosphere that unites Macon's neighbors and visitors alike. The festivities officially begin with the Flip the Switch event, which ignites the celebration and draws in sponsors, volunteers, and community members to witness the first magical moment when the lights illuminate the night. Women Build 2025

An annual event held in Macon for over 20 years, Women Build exemplifies the spirit of community and solidarity. Capital Build 2025

This year we participated in the first Georgia Capital Build hosted by Habitat for Humanity of Georgia. Thanks to our sponsors at Sheridan Construction we were able to take a group of volunteers to this historic event. Over 20 Habitat affiliates, over 100 volunteers, and over a dozen elected officials came together to frame an entire house in front of the Capital building.
